

Deerfield Parks & Recreation facilities, amenities, and services are supported by Township Residents through a one mill dedicated Park Levy. Your support funds seven full-time employees (1 Director, 4 Park Maintenance, 2 Recreation). In addition, nine part-time seasonal camp counselors are employed each summer to staff Deerfield Summer Camp.

In 2020, Deerfield Township consolidated the Road Department and Parks Department into a single Service Department, allowing increased efficiency. All Road and Park Maintenance Staff are cross-trained to assist on projects and fill in staffing gaps where needed. Positions in green below are funded through the Park Levy.





Community Spaces to Reflect, Gather, & Play

Parks and recreation have economic, health, environmental, and social value. They provide opportunities to connect with nature and one another, improve air and water quality, create gathering spaces for families and social groups, support trails for health and wellness, and maintain habitat for wildlife.

We manage over 460 acres of park and open space land (360 acres of parkland) for the community. Throughout the year, Service Department employees ensure the cleanliness of facilities, provide upkeep of landscape areas, and prepare/maintain sports fields and courts. Additionally, the Service Crew supports various recreation activities, community events, and special events.

Recreation Staff collaborate with outside organizations and receive support from other Township Departments to provide the most efficient use of resources. Examples include:

- Partnership with Warren County Sheriff's Office, which conducts Women's Self-Defense Classes for the community;
- Coordination with Deerfield Fire Rescue for participation in programs and events, such as Touch-A-Truck and summer camp special guests;
- Collaboration with the Mason Public Library on literacy programs held in the parks, the Deerfield Towne Center on several Annual Community Events, and The Arts Alliance for arts programming;
- Within the Deerfield Service Department, the Service Crew (Road and Park Maintenance) are an integral part of staffing and supporting community/special events;
- Deerfield Administration Department provides direct support through day-to-day customer inquiries and processing requests/purchases related to Snyder House Rentals and Standard Memorial Donations.
